		Processing of personal data is needed so that users can benefit from advanced features offered on our website. The EIT website also uses cookies to improve the functionality of the website. We respect user privacy and offer the ability to manage cookie preferences via a cookie consent popup. This allows users to make informed decisions about the tracking cookies used on our site. These preferences are anonymized to protect user privacy. For detailed information on the cookie usage of the EIT website, please refer to our Cookie policy page.	
		The information generated will be used by the EIT to evaluate your use of the website, enabling the EIT to compile reports on website activity for website operators and	



		providing other services relating to website activity and internet usage. Data is also used to improve the user's experience and to identify which domains and categories raise most interest.

Access to the personal data may be granted also to the European Ombudsman and the European Data Protection Supervisor upon request, the General Court and the European Court of Justice to the extent necessary for handling the review procedure and litigation.
