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

The EIT's 2018 Call for two new Innovation Communities

With a budget of almost EUR 2.4 billion from 2014 to 2020, the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT) creates sustainable growth and jobs by boosting innovation and entrepreneurship across Europe. To achieve this, we have pioneered dynamic European partnerships that bring together leading universities, research centres and companies. We call these unique partnerships 'Innovation Communities', or Knowledge and Innovation Communities (KICs).

Our six existing Innovation Communities are developing innovative products and services, creating new companies and training a new generation of entrepreneurs.

As an integral part of Horizon 2020, the EU Framework Programme for Research and Innovation, we will expand our activities in 2018 by launching a competition for two new Innovation Communities:

• EIT Manufacturing* strengthening and increasing the competitiveness of Europe's manufacturing industry



How Innovation Communities are created

Innovating through partnership

Joining the EIT Community is not like joining a research programme! An EIT Innovation Community must be born from a strong desire to do things differently, with like-minded people and organisations ready to experiment and operate at the boundaries of innovation. Innovation Communities must pioneer new solutions to society's biggest challenges and they must innovate. To do this, each Innovation Community sets its own strategy, objectives, business plan and structure, using EIT funding as seed money to attract other investors.

Delivering results

To date, the EIT's first three Innovation Communities, set up in 2010, have had almost 800 graduates from EIT entrepreneurial education programmes, have created more than 210 start-ups and have developed a wide range of new products and services. They have forged productive partnerships among almost 900 companies, universities and research organisations (the knowledge triangle) and mobilised private funding for innovation on a large scale.

A successful Innovation Community must innovate and have:

- ✓ impact the overarching principle
- brought together the knowledge triangle of business, education and research
- ✓ a long-term strategy
- ✓ a diverse, balanced and world-class partnership
- ✓ quality governance and lean management
- ✓ an integrated network of innovation hubs
- ✓ a sustainable business model and financial plan
- a policy for intellectual property
- ✓ a plan for outreach and dissemination
- ✓ an eye for synergies
