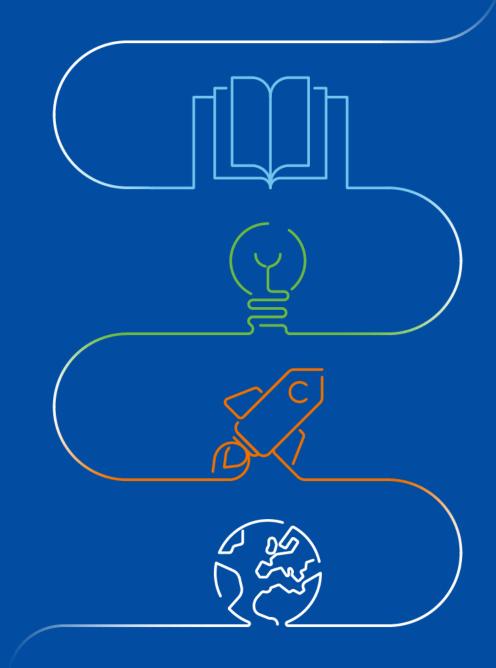

### United in Innovation

The new year kicked off with a strengthened commitment of cooperation between the European Innovation Council (EIC) and the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT). The EIT and the EIC signed a memorandum of understanding to work closer together for Europe's innovators.



Throughout 2021 and beyond the two organisations will join forces to fast-track support to highly innovative start-ups, as well as to coordinate efforts to support women innovators and innovators from less represented regions.





### EIT Strategy 2021-2027 agreed

The EIT welcomed the political agreement reached between the European Parliament and EU Member States on its legal basis and its new Strategic Innovation Agenda 2021 – 2027.



The new strategy will see the EIT increase its support to more innovators, entrepreneurs, students and citizens across Europe. It also saw the EIT launch two new initiatives in 2021, the new EIT KIC dedicated to Culture and Creative Sectors and Industries (see page 12) and the new initiative to boost the innovation capacity of Higher Education Institutions (see page 5). Innovation is key to ensuring a green and sustainable European recovery, and now, with a budget of almost EUR 3 billion, the EIT is well placed to strongly contribute.





### EIT Crisis Response Initiative – One Year On

On 10 March, the European Innovation Council and the European Institute of Innovation and Technology organised an online event opened by Mariya Gabriel, European Commissioner for Innovation, Research, Culture, Education and Youth, titled 'One year on: How European support is helping innovators develop solutions to tackle the COVID-19 pandemic'.

EIT's Contribution: The EIT allocated EUR 60 million to 62 innovative projects and 145 start-ups, scale-ups and SMEs, through the EIT Crisis Response Initiative in a record time (applicants reported feedback received in only 2 weeks). This investment was mobilised by Europe's largest innovation network to tackle the unprecedented social and economic challenges that the pandemic created. It resulted in concrete support for innovators and ventures working in health, climate change, digitalisation, food, sustainable energy, urban mobility, manufacturing and raw materials.

Innovations such as reusable, self-cleaning masks, an antibody platform to treat severe cases of infection and devices that can monitor patients remotely have addressed the immediate impact the pandemic has had on society.







# New EIT Call Launched To Boost Innovation In Higher Education

As part of its new strategy, the EIT launched the <u>HEI Initiative</u>: <u>Innovation Capacity Building for Higher Education</u> to unlock the full innovation potential of higher education institutions (HEIs). The initiative makes a systemic impact in increasing HEI's entrepreneurial and innovation capacity whilst integrating them into Europe's largest innovation ecosystem.

The open call for proposals drew 64 applications from close to 700 partners. Altogether 24 consortia of higher education institutions (HEIs) and non-academic organisations were selected and awarded EUR 1.2 million to implement their projects over a 24 month period starting from July 2021.

In November 2021, building on the success of the first call, a second call for proposals was launched under the EIT HEI Initiative which will see an additional 40 projects green-lit.

Janis Grevins is an academic executive with a strong focus on institutional development, technology implementation and business linkages. He has been the Director of Riga Business School at Riga Technical University since April 2003. He also serves as the independent member on the Supervisory Board of Tet Ltd., Latvia.



Nora Khaldi is the Founder and Chief Executive Officer of Nuritas, a biotech company committed to finding disease-beating molecules in food. Since launching in 2014, Nuritas has grown rapidly and boasts well-known funders and support from EU Horizon 2020 and the European Investment Bank, among others, raising over EUR 60 million to date.



Razvan Nicolescu served previously as the Romanian Minister of Energy. He is currently a partner of Deloitte Romania responsible for energy and climate change practice and an associate professor of the Romanian Academy for Economic Studies.



### EIT & EIF Join Forces to Boost Innovation in Europe

On 20 September 2021, the European Investment Fund (EIF) and the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT) strengthened their existing collaboration with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).

The MoU creates a framework for the EIF and the EIT to collaborate and share information on financing and innovation opportunities, in areas such as equity investments in European SMEs and start-ups, as well as key European sectors such as climate, digital and deep technologies, education and skills, energy and environmental technologies.

To provide interested applicants with more information about the upcoming Call for Proposals, the EIT hosted a series of webinars in November and December 2021. Over 850 participants took part in the series of webinars where they had the opportunity to learn about the EIT's innovation model and gain insight into how an EIT Knowledge and Innovation Community fosters innovation.













### EIT Community welcomes a new supported Unicorn

Portuguese <u>EIT Health</u>-supported start-up, <u>SWORD Health</u>, closed a Series D investment round in December worth USD 163 million and has reached a USD 2 billion valuation, thus becoming Portugal's first health 'Unicorn'. SWORD Health offers virtual care for patients with musculoskeletal (MSK) pain by matching them with digital therapists to facilitate pain management with exercise.
